

## Roda Mistry's Cheerful Acceptance

Roda Mistry passed into Meher Baba's waiting arms on July 8, 2006 at the age of 82. This was the culmination of a life lived in devotion and acceptance of Beloved Baba's wish and will.


Roda first met Meher Baba in 1927, when she was only three years old. Her paternal uncle, Framroze Dadachanji, was Baba's first secretary. Chanji, as he was affectionately called, had resided with Meher Baba for three years, and he was anxious to draw the rest of his family into Baba's fold, so he invited Roda's family to come on a picnic to Meherabad, where they first took Meher Baba's darshan in the building that is now the dharamshala.

As a result of these early contacts, Roda and the rest of her family became deeply devoted to Meher Baba. She had numerous opportunities to be with Baba and the women Mandali as she grew up, as well as during her married life. Her husband, Jimmy Mistry, served as a Meherabad Trustee for many years, and her three sons – Meherwan, Falu and Sarosh – as well as their families, are all devoted to Baba. Her son, Falu, has resided at Meherazad since 1978, and he now serves as a trustee for the Avatar Meher Baba Trust.

When Jimmy and Roda retired in 1979, they moved to Meherabad and lovingly served in many capacities there. One of Roda's main responsibilities was to care for Meher Baba's Samadhi, which she did with a quiet but palpable joy.

After Jimmy passed away in 1996, Roda moved to Meherazad, where her sister Arnavaz and her son Falu were living. Roda would greet pilgrims as they would arrive each day, and generously share with them from the treasure-trove of memories of her years with Beloved Baba.

During the last several years of her life, Roda suffered from a serious heart condition. This especially affected

her when she fell and broke her hip. Because of the vulnerability of her heart, surgery to repair her hip could not be performed. This meant that Roda experienced excruciating pain whenever she moved her legs or torso even slightly.

I had the good fortune to be part of Roda's care team during the period immediately following her hip injury. The acceptance and cheerfulness with which she endured significant and unrelenting pain continue to amaze me. Roda's heartfelt resignation to Beloved Baba's will is a gift and a teaching that I will always cherish. She would often say, in the midst of tremendous pain, "I saw Baba

suffer from the pain in His hip after His second accident – this is nothing."

Throughout the final years of Roda's life, she maintained a joyous and cheerful attitude in the midst of suffering that was uplifting to all those around her. Her loving and joyous spirit and her unfailing focus on Beloved Baba will be treasured by all who knew her.

# Reflecting on Meher Mount's 50th Anniversary

Saturday, the 5th of August was a cool, sunny day with breezes, and the mountain looked very beautiful as we came to Meher Mount, Ojai, to celebrate the anniversary of Beloved Meher Baba's visit there in 1956.

The day began with continental breakfast under marquees, across from the huge beautiful tree, possibly 300 years old, that Baba sat under when He visited there. As arti was held under the tree, with a little low altar with flowers and a pretty Samadhi cloth marking the spot where Baba sat, that lovely Baba feeling filled the heart. Billy Goodrum, the musical guest, led prayers and some songs as others arrived from near and far.

There is a sweet fragrance of suffering and struggle around Meher Mount and all involved with the property, especially, of course, for Agnes Baron, who lived on the mountain for many years and was called Agni (fire) by Baba. A huge fire swept through the property in the 80s and left us with the tree and a brick fireplace, which features a photo of Baba from His visit in 1956. A lovely Santa Fe style building has been built with a modest hall, accommodations for the resident caretakers, a kitchen and a bathroom for pilgrims.

The opening program was a dramatic reading of *The Song Of The New Life* with many readers. It was moving and most effective and somehow imparted the feeling of Meher Mount, its struggle, and of Agnes and all she went through to hold on to this property. Adele Wolkin, who was part of the group with Baba the day He came to Meher Mount, talked about that day. Then an unusual and lovely letter written by Dr. Ned Burlinson was read. Dr. Burlinson cared for Baba and the mandali injured in the 1952 accident in Prague, Oklahoma. Baba was on His way to California at the time of the accident, which delayed His coming to Meher Mount until August of 1956.

Ray Johnston, the caretaker, led games of marbles during the day, and one could see images of Baba at Meher Mount on a TV screen anytime. The music was organized by Billy Goodrum, who announced that he and his family would be moving to Asheville, North Carolina. Billy reminisced that a few years earlier he, too, had been a caretaker at Meher Mount. He told stories of the wonder and difficulties of that time. He sang and led a few singalongs, including Robert Een, Raine Eastman-Gannett, and Jim Whitson for a song or two. Then Ed Flanagan read of Baba's visit to Meher Mount from *Lord Meher*.

Great food, bought up to Ojai by all the anniversary attendees, so delicious, as good as any restaurant, punctuated the day's reflection. Coffee and tea were available at all times, and no one wanted to leave this glorious Baba spot. Many signed up for a lasagna dinner. The dinner became a great setting for Baba stories, one after another. After dinner all went over past the tree and gazed at the beautiful view of a nearby city and stars and bright three-quarter moon, while the mystical Native American mountain Topa Topa, gazed over at us.

Meher Mount is quite distinctive in its ability to reveal a spirit of Baba that is new and refreshing, a side of Baba that is both difficult and free. The Meher Mount Board, who run its Trust, are aware of that unique quality. Caretakers Ray and Elizabeth Johnston work extremely hard to make sure that Meher Mount, and its history with Baba, are beautifully preserved. Emerging new stories and many old memories created a perfect 50th Anniversary.
